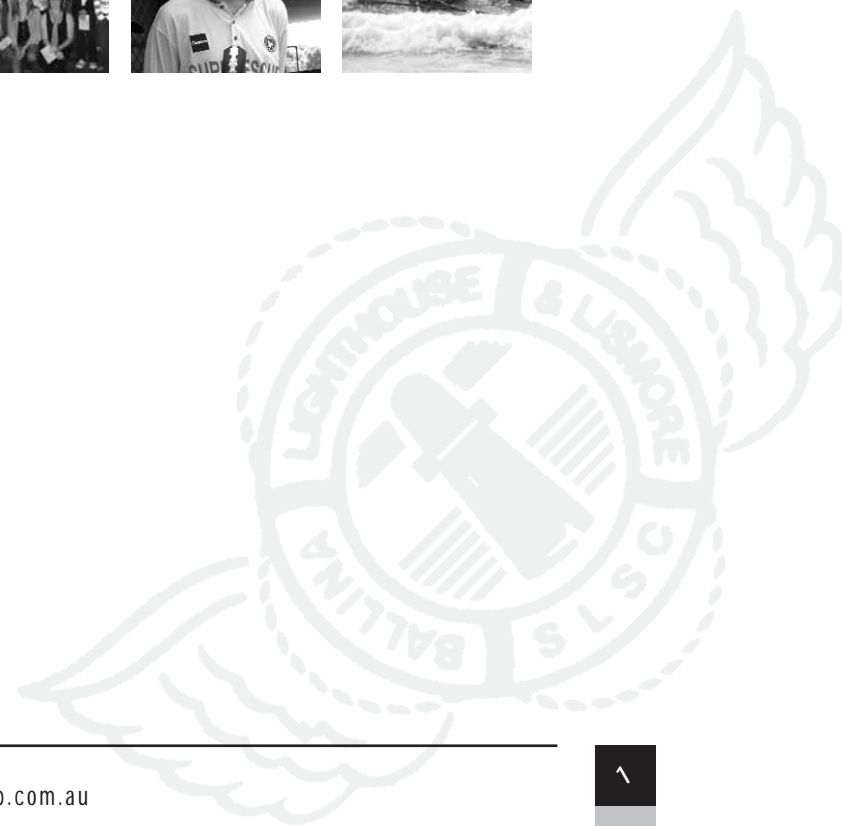

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# SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

## In the community

Throughout the year, our members engaged in a plethora of community activities. These included the Cancer Council's Relay for Life event (October), and Ballina's Rivafest dragon boat race.



**Young citizen** On Australia Day, our club captain Joe Keane was named Ballina's Young Citizen of the Year. He became the 5th member in 15 years to take out the prestigious award. A few days later, Joe joined Life Member (and Past President) Ron Shepherd in the Commonwealth Games Baton Relay. The pair were chosen for their outstanding contribution to surf life saving.



## Ball of a time

In October, our club members put their dancing shoes on, and raised over \$6000 at the inaugural Life Savers for Cancer Research Charity Ball at the Ballina RSL. We even auctioned off the RSL chef Gerhard Spatz in the process! Our special guests included Australian ironman champ Zane Holmes and Dr Therese Becker from Westmead Institute for Cancer Research.



**Lest we forget** In November, we reached an agreement with the Ballina RSL Sub-branch to temporarily house our war memorial board. The board had been previously housed in the Lighthouse Beach club house, which was specifically built as a memorial to the 18 members who lost their lives during the Second World War (139 club members in total joined the armed forces).



## Community support

In December, the fabulous ladies at Ballina Scope Club hosted a 'Singin' in the Rain' fundraising night in aid of our club. Many of our members attended the Ballina Players' production, and Scope raised over \$3000.

**Vital equipment stolen** In November, vital surf life saving equipment (including two 'Oxyviva' machines, four Oxygen cylinders, two hand-held beach radios and a fully stocked first aid kit) was stolen from our Shelly Beach clubhouse. Staunch club supporter Paradise FM launched an appeal that raised over \$6000 in just one week, enabling us to replace all the stolen equipment and upgrade our security system and locks. A big thanks to Paradise FM, Ballina Lions Club, Ballina Bowling Club, Ballina Scope Club, Ballina Shire Council, Lennox Head - Alstonville Surf Life Saving Club, Advanced Alarms, Ballina Locksmiths and the Ballina community for their amazing support in our time of need.

## Taking care of business

In a bid to forge new relationships with the local business community, we joined the Ballina Chamber of Commerce & Industry (BCCI). Our President Paul Kelly was a special guest speaker at a BCCI breakfast meeting in September, and in March, we hosted an 'alfresco' Business After Hours networking function at Shelly Beach.



## Fundraising

Our Doorknock appeal in April (our biggest annual fundraising event) raised close to \$10,000. We rely heavily on the generous support of individuals and organisations in the local community, so events like the Doorknock are vital to our existence.



**Our members** During the season, our members donated countless hours of their time to patrolling Ballina's beaches. We notched up 3508 hours of patrol time, performed 40 rescues, and prevented 503 potentially dangerous situations. To cope with increasing demand, we were able to grow our 'active patrol' membership base from 74 members to 114.



## Our home

Negotiations continued with the Ballina Shire Council and Department of Lands regarding the upgrading of our clubhouse facilities (following the demolition of the Lighthouse Beach Surf Club in 2005).



**Girl power!** We welcomed our first female boat crew in 3 years to the water this season. The 'awesome foursome' of Briohny Everett, Kaela Lyons, Tarren Lynch and Lisette Holmes keenly contested the state and national titles, where they did our club proud.

## New equipment

In June, we bid a fond farewell to our old club tractor, and replaced it with a John Deere Gator Utility vehicle. This new piece of vital equipment increases the mobility of our lifesaving service allowing for both a quick response to incidents and for mobile



surveillance patrols. It was made possible by a \$12,500 Community Development & Support Expenditure grant from the Ballina RSL. Our sincere thanks go to the Ballina RSL, to John Deere's Manager (Commercial) Kel Davidson, and to club member Rod Balkin who worked tirelessly on the project. John Deere provided the Gator to the club at a significantly reduced price, and in exchange the club agreed to be the 'test case' for John Deere to launch its 'Gator' into the specialist surf club market. We are pleased to report that the machine has performed well above expectations, and we will continue to work with John Deere to provide feedback on the Gator's performance in the surf club environment.

## Building our capacity

Providing our members with ongoing training and education is an essential component of our business. A large number of members took the opportunity to grow and/or update their skills, completing numerous courses and attaining various awards. 25 people gained their bronze medallion and five secured the gold medallion (advanced life saving).



**And the winner is...** Our members took home a string of prestigious awards at both the 2005 and 2006 Surf Life Saving Far North Coast Awards. In 2005, we scooped the Lifesaver, Junior Lifesaver and Cadet Lifesaver categories, and in 2006 the Lifesaver and Cadet Lifesaver awards. We were very proud to receive a 'High Commendation' certificate in the 2006 Club of the Year award.

Those attending thoroughly enjoyed the night and the event raised the profile of the club and surf life saving in the local community. The night raised valuable funds for both our club and the Australian Cancer Research Foundation. What a great partnership!



Whilst the ball was the start of our fundraising efforts for 2005-06, our sponsors over the season assisted us to obtain the right equipment, training and infrastructure to do what we do best - provide a safe and fun beach environment. Our thanks go

to our major sponsors and supporters who are detailed in this report, in particular the Ballina RSL Club, who assisted us with the acquisition of a John Deere Gator to replace our old tractor.

The community came to our rescue in November 2005 when we experienced a major theft of valuable rescue and radio equipment. Our local radio station, Paradise FM, generously led the charge with a fundraising appeal to replace the stolen gear and our friends at the Lennox Head Surf Club helped out with loan equipment for patrols whilst the stolen gear was being replaced.

The season has seen our patrolling membership grow with our trainers kept busy with courses for both new and existing members. Our volunteer lifesavers clocked up in excess of 3500 hours patrolling our beaches this past season - thanks to each and every one of you.

Following the demolition of the Lighthouse Beach Surf Club in June 2005, we commenced discussions with both Ballina Shire Council and the Department of Lands in an effort to upgrade our clubhouse facilities. This is crucial to us keeping pace with the demands on the club's patrol and rescue services.

In January our club assisted the Far North Coast Branch with space to establish a new radio room facility at the storage sheds remaining at Lighthouse Beach. This was achieved in consultation with members of the Branch and Ballina Shire Council to enable a key piece of infrastructure for our Branch to be upgraded.

Developing surf sports opportunities will be a focus of our club for the next season and beyond. Whilst our representation at carnivals has been only small in numbers, it has been big in enthusiasm. The addition of a female boat crew in time for the Australian Titles was the first step in this goal.

The Junior Activities Committee has continued to keep our junior membership strong, with a number of nipper parents attaining their bronze medallion over the season and a number of nippers graduating into the senior ranks.

The recent Annual Presentation & Awards Night was a great celebration of the work done by our members (both on and off the beach) this season.

special thanks go to club Treasurer Kris Beavis, who handled the ensuing mountain of paperwork, and who continues to ensure the club maintains a sound financial status. Paradise FM

ran an appeal to replace the stolen equipment and again the local community came to the rescue. The list of donors is too numerous to list here, but special mention goes to Ballina Bowling Club and the Ballina Lions Club who both made substantial donations, along with Ron Marriott of Northern Rivers Cleaning Services and Paul Wilson of Wilson's Paint Barn who donated substantial raffle prizes.

- In December the wonderful ladies of the Ballina Scope Club hosted a fundraiser night at a performance of the Ballina Players 'Singin' in the Rain' production. The \$3,000 raised was earmarked towards the cost of renovating our beach patrol shelter.
- We enjoyed some fabulous beach weather during December and January and many of our members enjoyed a social BBQ for Australia Day at the Shelly Beach clubhouse.
- On Australia Day our Club Captain Joe Keane was recognised in the Shire's Australia Day Awards (Young Citizen of the Year). The club nominated Joe in recognition of the mountain of work he has done at a club and branch level in his relatively short surf life saving career. Not only does he dedicate many hours to our club, but also has taken on a number of roles - specifically within the youth development field - at a Branch level, which is to be commended. Joe has also been an Age Manager for our nippers over the past few seasons.
- The other highlight worthy of note is the quantity of training completed during the season. The club now has four more qualified trainers (Toni Sales, Joe Keane, Rod Balkin & Steve McNabb (IRB)) which makes us more self-sufficient and has enabled us to provide training for our existing members. Toni Sales has done a great job in her new role as Chief Instructor.

### GRANT APPLICATIONS AND NEW EQUIPMENT

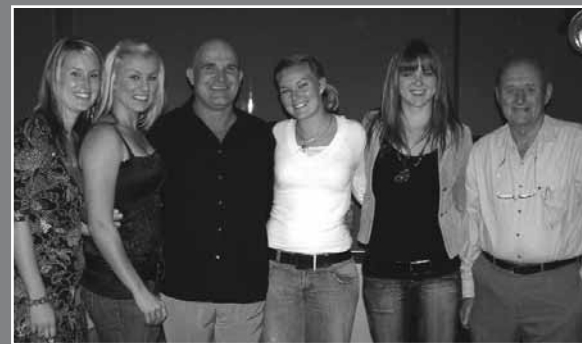

## CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

It is with a great sense of satisfaction that I report that no lives were lost on our patrolled beach this season - a proud record that has stood since our club's inception 73 years ago.

This record is true testament to the dedication of our volunteer surf lifesavers, who worked together to rescue 40 people in distress, administer first aid on 38 occasions, and prevent 503 potentially dangerous situations. These rescue figures represent a significant increase (100%) based on last year's figures, whilst the number of preventative actions increased by around 400.

Our gratitude and thanks go out to all our volunteer surf life savers, whose collective knowledge and skills in a variety of dangerous and high-risk situations ensured that Ballina's beaches remained safe throughout the season. The professional manner with which these exceptional individuals conduct themselves is second to none, and they are a credit to our club.

Thankfully, this season our active patrolling membership base increased from 74 to 114 members, which enabled the load to be shared. While this is a remarkable achievement, we must also pay tribute to our current and past members who have been the backbone of this Club during the challenging times. These dedicated members gave willingly of their time to ensure our patrol obligations were always met, often going above the call of duty. We are indeed lucky to have such committed people within our ranks.

In particular, I would like to recognise the outstanding efforts of three of our life savers, who contributed in excess of eighty hours to patrol Shelly Beach and its surrounding beaches. While this remarkable statistic acknowledges the time and effort that has gone into patrolling the beach, it doesn't reflect the multitude of hours spent behind the scenes. Thank you to Rod Balkin (107.5 hours), Dani Eddy (96.5 hours), Steve McNabb (88 hours) and to those members who broke the 50-hour mark and whose level of service must also be highly commended.

An integral requirement of our business is the need to keep our surf lifesavers equipped with current first aid and rescue techniques via ongoing training and education. Our special thanks are extended to our Chief Instructor Toni Sales and her dedicated team of trainers and assessors, for helping to increase the knowledge and skill of our patrolling surf life savers. Over the season it was pleasing to see a considerable amount of new and existing members extend their knowledge by obtaining new awards. During

the annual proficiencies, all active bronze medallion holders updated their skills to obtain a Certificate II in Public Safety Aquatic Rescue, while other members broadened their expertise by obtaining various awards including Defibrillator Certificate, Senior First Aid Certificate along with Silver and Gold medallions - congratulations!

As beach visitation continues to rise, so too do the number of incidents occurring in the water. This season the Far North Coast region registered the state's highest drowning statistics (six people drowned on Far North Coast beaches). While this generates a harsh reminder to always swim between the flags, it more importantly reminds our club of the need to extend our patrolling operations to meet the growing number of people using all of our beaches.

To this end, the Ballina Shire Council has decided to extend its lifeguard contract to patrol week days during the entire surfing season. From late September 2006 until April 2007, the Ballina Lighthouse and Lismore Surf Life Saving Club will patrol Shelly Beach (in conjunction with professional lifeguards) for seven days a week. The club is very supportive of these changes and looks forward to continuing the relationship with Surf Life Saving Services in a bid to make all Ballina beaches a safe and enjoyable destination.

To the Patrol Captains, thank you for your continued support in my role as Club Captain. I have been privileged this season to have you all onboard; your professional attitude, knowledge and experience are truly appreciated. To Brent and Lara in your roles as Vice Captain, thank you for the work that you have done and more importantly the support you provided. Thank you to the management committee, whose guidance and leadership has ensured this club is one of the most thriving clubs on the Far North Coast of New South Wales. Finally, I thank all members and their families for contributing towards the most vital community organisation in Australia.

As next season peeps over the horizon I can only feel that the best is yet to come!

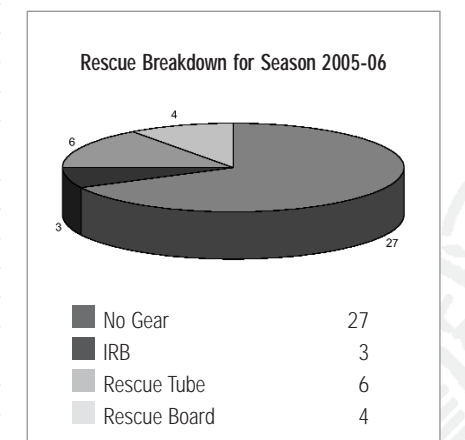
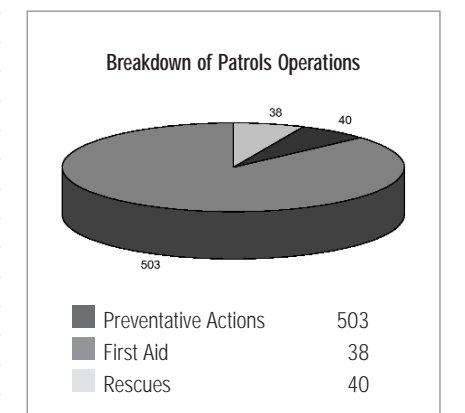
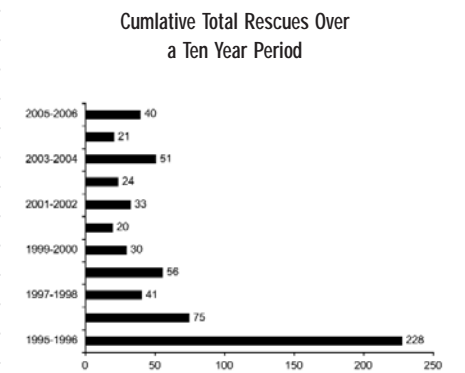

**1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial report is a special purpose report prepared for use by the Executive Committee and members. The Executive Committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity.

No Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been used in the preparation of this financial report.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of the financial report.

**(a) Income Tax**

The Club is a charitable institution and is therefore exempt from income tax under current income tax legislation.

**(b) Club Equipment**

Equipment is carried at the then Executive Committee's valuation as at 30 April 1995, together with additions at cost from that date.

Any gain or loss on disposal is determined as the difference between the carrying amount of the asset at the time of disposal and the proceeds of disposal, and is included in the profit and loss account in the year of disposal.

Equipment is depreciated at 10% or 20% per annum using the prime cost method. The Executive Committee is of the opinion that those rates are based on a practical assessment of the expected useful economic lives of those assets.

The then Executive Committee took this decision due to the unreliability of the listing of Club equipment that existed prior to the financial year to 30 April 1995, coupled with the inability to identify the Asset Revaluation Reserve with specific equipment.

**(c) Valuation of Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock**

The above investment bond (with a face value of \$410,000) has been valued at its indexed value as at 30 April 2006 on the assumption that it will be held until its maturity in the year 2015.

While the Club will receive the full indexed value at maturity, if the Club were to sell the investment on the open market it would depend upon market forces as to whether the investment could realise its indexed value. The investment's market value as at 30 April 2006 was \$630,752, however the Executive Committee has taken a conservative approach by valuing the investment at the lower indexed value.

The appreciation/(depreciation) in the indexed value of the investment between the beginning and end of the financial year has been treated as current year revenue/(loss).

**(d) Comparative Amounts**

Where necessary, the figures for the previous year have been reclassified to facilitate comparison.

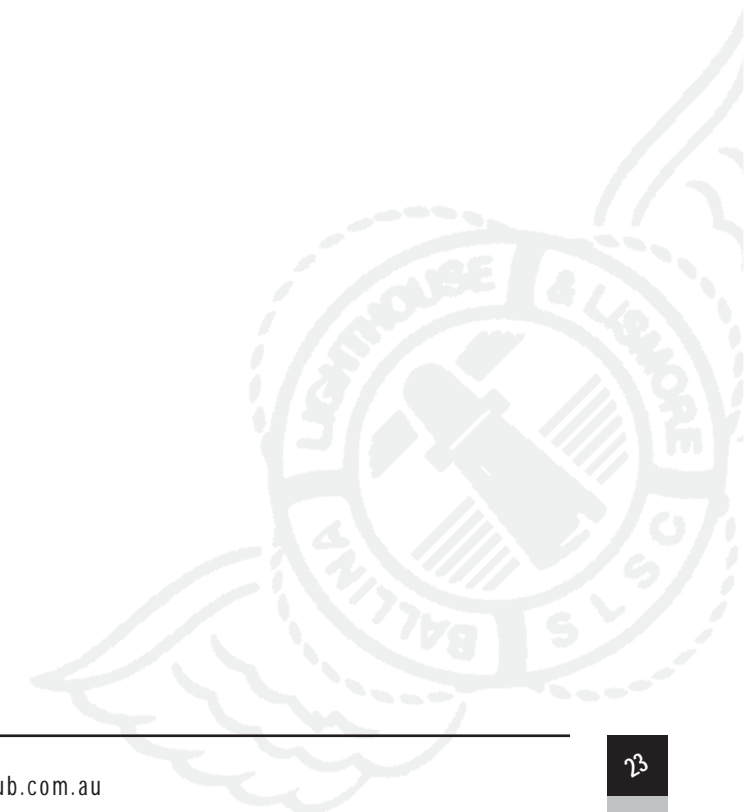
